

Mr Raymond Kendall

Former Secretary-General of Interpol (Chair)

An international expert on crime and security, Mr Raymond Kendall served three terms as Secretary General of Interpol from 1985 to 2000.

Prior to his work with Interpol, Mr Kendall spent much of his career at New Scotland Yard Special Branch, rising to the rank of Deputy Assistant Commissioner of the London Metropolitan Police. In 1971, he became Assistant Director of Drugs at the International Criminal Police Organisation (ICPO)-Interpol, and was promoted to Director four years later.

More recently, Mr Kendall has also served as Chairman of the Supervisory Committee of the European Anti-Fraud Office, OLAF (Office Européen de Lutte Anti-Fraude).

During his career, Mr Kendall has been awarded many honours, including Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur (France), the Queen's Police Medal for Distinguished Police Service (United Kingdom), and Bearer of the Saint Martyr Triphon Order - First Class (Russia).
